Martin Loučka is founder of the Center for Palliative Care, psychologist, assistant professor in the Department of Medical Psychology at the 3rd Faculty of Medicine, Charles University. He studied palliative care in a doctoral program at Lancaster University in England and, as a Fulbright scholar, worked at the Icahn School of Medicine in New York. He completed a long-term internship at VU Medical Center in Amsterdam, a course on complicated grief at Columbia University in New York, and comprehensive training in Gestalt therapy at the Dialog Institute. He has received numerous awards for his work in the development of palliative care. He completed the Palliative Care Education and Practice program at Harvard Medical School, and in 2019 received a fellowship from the Abakus Foundation for leaders in palliative care. In 2024, he received a fellowship from Ashoka, a worldwide organization supporting social change makers. Clinically, he works as a psychologist in the palliative care department at Thomayer University Hospital in Prague.
