Assistant Professor at The Interuniversity Department of Regional & Urban Studies and Planning at the Politecnico di Torino University (Italy), where she received her PhD in History and Critics of Architectural and Environmental Heritage Program. Her research interests include the role of cultural heritage in social innovation processes, urban and architectural history, and digital humanities. Currently, she is involved in heritage-related international research projects (RESILIAGE Horizon Europe) and she coordinates national research-action projects on collaborative and inclusive practices for fragile communities. She collaborates with the Cultural Welfare Centre, interdisciplinary centre on expertise on Culture and Health, as Deputy Director of the Executive Master 'Culture and Health', an annual educational program launched in 2021 aimed at strengthening skills in the design and evaluation of cultural welfare interventions.
