Use of chemotherapy at the end of life (EOL) is discouraged, but evidence to guide decisions on the use of novel systemic anticancer treatment (SACT) agents is lacking. Using Ontario Cancer Registry data, we examined trends of SACT and health services use at EOL, among 68,963 adults diagnosed with solid tumors or hematologic malignancies within 5 years of death, who received SACT between March 2015 and March 2021. Use of SACT at the EOL increased significantly over time, driven by increased use of immunotherapy. SACT use at the EOL, regardless of its type, was associated with high health services use and hospital death. These findings have implications for quality indicators and guidelines on the use of SACT at the EOL; specifically, it has been recommended that the indicator, NQF 0210: "percentage of patients who died from cancer while receiving chemotherapy in the last 14 days of life," developed by ASCO and the National Quality Forum (NQF), should be updated to include novel cancer treatments and extended to the last 30 days of life.

Family caregivers of patients with advanced cancer often have poor quality of life and mental health. In this comprehensive meta-analysis of 56 articles reporting on 49 trials involving 8554 caregivers, we examined the efficacy of interventions offering support for caregivers of patients with advanced cancer. We demonstrated that interventions targeting caregivers, dyads or patients and their families led to significant improvements in caregiver quality of life and mental health, with no significant differences according to the target population of the intervention. These data support the routine provision of interventions to improve wellbeing in caregivers of patients with advanced cancer. This publication has been cited more than 70 times and was among the most-cited articles in JNCI: Journal of the National Cancer Institute in 2024.

We randomized 69 participants to STEP (n=33) or screening alone (n=36). At 6 months, 45% of STEP participants and 17% of screening alone participants had received palliative care (p=0.009). Trends for all outcomes favored STEP, including quality of life, symptom control, depression, and satisfaction with care. Sixteen participants

completed qualitative interviews, describing symptom screening as helpful to initiate communication; triggered referral as beneficial; and referral to palliative care as timely. This trial was one of the first to demonstrate that symptom screening and targeted referral to palliative care was not only feasible but also improved access to palliative care, compared to reliance on oncologist referrals. Based on these data, we now have CIHR funding to conduct a large multicenter trial of an adapted STEP intervention (STEP2) in more than 650 patients.

This single-arm phase II trial of our Symptom Screening With Targeted Early Palliative Care (STEP) intervention in 116 patients with advanced cancer. Symptoms were screened in oncology clinics; moderate to severe symptoms triggered a call from a nurse who offered an outpatient palliative care referral. We demonstrated that STEP was feasible and that patients whose symptoms did not trigger a referral maintained stable quality of life over 6 months. We also demonstrated that symptom control and mood improved over time for those who accepted and received a triggered referral, and declined for those who declined and did not receive palliative care, emphasizing the importance of encouraging patients to accept the triggered referral. This was one of the first trials of triggered palliative care referral and has already been cited more than 40 times.

Early palliative care improves the quality of life and satisfaction with care of patients with advanced cancer, but less is known about its effect on caregivers. As part of our large cluster randomized trial of early palliative care versus standard oncology care, we recruited caregivers of patients with advanced cancer. Although patients, rather than caregivers, were the target of our intervention, we demonstrated that early palliative care increased satisfaction with medical care in caregivers of patients with advanced cancer. This paper shows that the benefits of early palliative care also extend to caregivers and has been cited more than 200 times.

*In this large qualitative study of 71 patients and caregivers participating in our cluster-randomized trial, we examined perceptions of palliative care in patients who received (or did not receive) early palliative care. This study affirmed that there is a strong stigma attached to palliative care, particularly regarding its association with death and dying, which may persist even after positive experiences with early palliative care. We conclude that education of patients, health care providers and the public about the relevance and benefit of early palliative care is paramount for the success of this new model. This study was published with an invited commentary (Caprio AJ. Palliative care: renaming as supportive care and integration into comprehensive cancer care. *CMAJ*. 2016 Jul 12;188(10):711-2). Patients with advanced cancer have compromised quality of life, and access to specialized palliative care tends to be late. At the time we conducted this study, the World Health Organization recommended involvement of palliative care early in the disease course, but evidence for this recommendation was lacking. This cluster randomized trial in 461 patients with advanced cancer demonstrated that early specialized palliative care led to improved quality of life, symptom control, and satisfaction with care, compared to standard oncology care. The initial abstract form of this

cluster randomized trial of early palliative care was chosen for a podium presentation at the American Society for Clinical Oncology (ASCO) meeting in Chicago (2012), where it was also selected for "Best of ASCO" and listed under "Notable Advances in Patient and Survivor Care" in ASCO's 2013 Annual Report. The paper was published with an accompanying editorial and commentary, was featured widely in the national and international media (Altmetric 99th percentile), and has been cited more than 2000 times. It has been used as evidence for the effectiveness of early palliative care in several national and international guidelines, including the American Society of Clinical Oncology Clinical Practice Guideline (2017; 2024), which recommends routine early integration of palliative care into standard oncology care.

This survey of 603 Canadian medical, radiation and surgical oncologists (72% participation) describes their referral practices to specialized palliative care (SPC) and identifies characteristics associated with early referral. Findings included that one third would refer to SPC earlier if it were renamed Supportive Care, and that availability of comprehensive SPC and acceptance of SPC services of patients on active chemotherapy were the main barriers to early referral. Oncologists who had completed a rotation in palliative care were more likely to refer earlier. We conclude that better availability of SPC for all patients with advanced cancer, as well as education of oncologists in palliative care, would improve timely access to palliative care. *This phase II study provided evidence to proceed with the larger trial above, and continues to be cited as evidence supporting outpatient palliative care. We evaluated prospectively the efficacy of an outpatient palliative care clinic in improving patient symptom distress and satisfaction with care among 150 patients with advanced cancer. Patients with advanced cancer received a consultation in the clinic by a palliative care physician and nurse, and completed measures at one week and one month. Statistically and clinically significant improvements were observed for overall symptom control, and for individual symptoms of pain, fatigue, nausea, depression, anxiety, drowsiness, appetite, dyspnea, insomnia and constipation. The paper was published with an accompanying editorial (Byock, I. *In this seminal systematic review, we showed that evidence was lacking to support the effectiveness of specialized palliative care in improving quality of life and other outcomes. However, most studies lacked statistical power to report conclusive results, quality of life measures were not specific for terminally ill patients, and there were substantial difficulties with recruitment, attrition and compliance. We concluded that carefully planned trials, using a standardized palliative care intervention and measures constructed specifically for this population, were needed. This study was selected for Online CME Quiz Questions. *JAMA* 2008; 299(14): 172; was reviewed in *Journal Watch Oncology and Hematology* (Murphy, B. *JWatch* 2008 Apr 8; 2008:2-2) and in *BMJ* (Tonks, A. All you need to read in the other general journals. "Urgently needed: good trials of specialized palliative care services." *BMJ* 2008; 336(7649): 856-857) and has been cited more than 600 times. It led to my involvement in another systematic review of palliative care effectiveness, also published in *JAMA*, (Kavalieratos et al. 2016), which showed an improvement in trial quality from the first review and significant improvements in quality of life and symptom burden from palliative care interventions.*
